Compulsory REVISION comments	<p>Interesting topic, but the paper needs structural restructuring.</p> <p>Too few references, and the way of referencing is not consistent at all.</p> <p>Some more background information about the Wadiya people would be necessary.</p> <p>Why did you not incorporate a control group? (i.e. non-tribal people)</p> <p>It is good you focus on several aspects of exclusion, but what were your exact indicators? Show us a more complete table, divide each dimension in several indicators.</p> <p>You can't compare means of percentages with each other. Unless you make some kind of score based on these results – but the statistical tests to compare the differences are incorrect.</p>	
Minor REVISION comments	<p>p.29 – a bit strange sentence, the French government focussing on social exclusion? Where does that come from?</p> <p>Referencing format is inconsistent.</p>
