Strains and stresses are the hallmarks of coalitioning, In Nigeria's 1959, a Northern Peoples Congress NPC plus Nigerian National Alliance NNA coalition failed within two years, so did another between UPGA United Progressives Grand Alliance, and NNA Nigerian National Alliance, within two years, 1963/1964. Both were formed just before or just after general elections and were unsustainable. Coalitions just like federalism are always contentious and crises prone especially in developing countries.</p>
