This aspect of supervision might be especially difficult to deal with and it would have been interesting to have a somewhat broader discussion in the framework of a person centred supervision and experiential learning.</p> <p>Ethical Issue- Yes. Ethical issues have a special part in the paper, related to ethical issues in supervision such as emphasis on values, confidentiality, evaluation of supervisee's work etc.</p>

It gives a good overview and discussion of clinical supervision and a person centred perspective.</p> <p>The paper has a heading of a review paper.
